\$50,000,000 520 West 28th Street, Penthouse No. 37 Chelsea

This five-bedroom, 6,853-square-foot home, in a building designed by the architect Zaha Hadid, was the most viewed (moving up from fourth place in March). It has massive walls of glass and multiple terraces; amenities include a pool and a private IMAX theater.

\$1,250,000 186 Seeley Street Windsor Terrace, Brooklyn

Next was a two-family rowhouse with four bedrooms and two baths. Less than a block from Prospect Park, the home has prewar details, a terrace overlooking the backyard and private parking. It could revert to a single-family home, if desired.

\$985,000 315 East 12th Street, No. 8 East Village

Third was a pet-friendly two-bedroom, onebath co-op on a tree-lined block, with a renovated kitchen and exposed brick. Building rules allow co-buying, buying for children and use as a pied-à-terre. There is a flexible subletting policy

\$1,950,000 140 Nassau Street, No. 6A Financial District

A two-bedroom loft with vaulted ceilings and arched windows was the next most popular. The co-op, which has two spa-like bathrooms, intricate moldings, floor-to-ceiling closets and in-unit laundry, is in the Morse Building, dating to 1879.
